Chris Young is a bit of an underdog in Country Music, getting his start on Nashville Star and releasing his self-titled debut album on RCA Records on October 2006. His newest album. "The Man I Want To Be," was released on August 31, 2009 with the first hit single, "Gettin' You Home (the black dress song) being the first song of his to actually get radio play. At fan fair this year, a few of us had the pleasure of attending his birthday party where he performed live, and what a voice he has! A true, deep, steady country voice that really makes all of his songs stand out. If you haven't yet picked up his album here's a glance of the treat you'll receive!

That Makes Me

The album opens with a fun fast track about being proud to be 'Hillbilly Country.' In my opinion a little bit too old for Chris Young but he's got that manly voice to pull it off. Its the kind of song you might hear at a rodeo bar while shooting back a cold one, energetic and possibly even danceworthy. I think it gives a good preview of the album's tone and message in general.

Voices

Another personal song, (and no, not one about being skitso!) but a very thoughtful one about how the people he grew up with influenced the man he is today. "I hear voices like my Dad sayin' quit that team and you'll be a quitter for the rest of



your life." Its a song we can all relate to as we grow up, the lessons people teach us that stick with us.

The Dashboard

This song slows it down a bit, a sentimental song about two brothers, one is shipping off to the army and they're reminissing over memories about one of the brother's trucks. "If I don't come back, you can have this Ford, just leave a picture of me on the dashboard." Its sad but heartfelt, the kind of song that really leaves you thinking for a few minutes after its over.

Gettin' You Home (Black Dress Song)
This song is Chris' first major hit and with
good reason! Its sexy, honest and straight
-foreward, the kind of song that leaves
girls blushing but at the same time we'd

definitely want to be the girl in that video, where the guy is completely focused on nothing else in the world but us. Of all the songs on this album this is the one I recommend the most, especially to the ladies!

It Takes A Man

This is a thoughtful song about responsibility, about a young couple finding out they're having a baby, the man realizing that he'd have to be a grown-up now, etc. Its a song about morals and realizations, even if we've not been in this exact situation its still a life-changing moment we can all relate to in one way or another. The tone fits the lesson of the song and his strong voice carries it through beautifully.

This album really focuses on the individual, on growing up, learning life's lessons and reflecting on the past in order to figure out he is and where he wants go head in the future. Chris may be a bit of an underdog but we feel he's definitely on his way to big-time success! We highly recommend this album if you haven't listened vet!

The Shoebox

"Don't forget to fill a shoebox with the things that mean the most." This is a really cute song about preserving memories and I think we can all relate to it, how many of us have stumbled upon something we had as a child and been all "Aww I'm glad I saved this!" Its just a soft sweet song that puts a smile on your face.

Rose In Paradise

This song was a duet with Willie Nelson! Its an old-fashioned story song about a man who presumably had a trophy-wife, she grew wretless and end up running off with another man. Now he just looks at the empty garden and the life he once had with regrets. Pretty much one of those warning songs warning men against ending up old and alone if they don't treat their woman right.

Twenty-One Candles

This song is fast paced and carefree about a bit of a wild-girl who "ain't gonna wait on twenty-one candles, ain't gonna miss one minute of fun!" Its another bar song that you could throw back a cold one to and get out on the floor and kick up your heels! A shorter quicker song but definitely gets the energy pumped up!

The Man I Want To Be

This title track is a very heartfelt song that really sums up the entire theme of the album, again a song about growing up, about finally realizing the mistakes he's made and the person he wants to strive to be. Its about surrendering himself to a higher power and asking for help to be that man. Its emotional and again, something we can all relate to. The writing and tone of the song flows beautifully and personally I think it sounds best live-acoustic. Definitely worth a listen!

The album concludes with another softer, heartfelt song, sad and yet thought-provoking and reflective, really capping off the inner journey Chris took throughout the making of this album. Love, loss, lessons and finding himself. Vocals on this song are steady and really dig under your skin to pull at your heartstrings.


Entertainer Of The Year

A Perspective on Songwriting



"Maybe next time he'll think before he cheats!" "I'm not ready to make nice!" "I'm goin' out tonight in my red high-heels!" "God blessed the broken road that lead me straight to you."

All amazing, memorable songs have one thing in common, the hook. The hook is one of the central most important things about songwriting, it has to exhibit a powerful emotion and make a distinct memorable statement. Songwriting is one of my great loves in life, I've been writing for over five years and every time I sit down with a pen in my hand, stare at the blinking curser my laptop screen or strum on my guitar randomly hoping to produce something less than random, I take a minute to myself, close my eyes take a breath and dwell on either a memory or a daydream. "Write what you know" is a phrase every writer has heard no matter what kind of writing they do, and it might be cliche but its also one of the truest statements there is. Every single successful song out there was written about either an event that actually happened, or a daydream; something someone wishes would happen. Some great songs are about love, some are about hate, some about growing up, some about revenge, yet others are simply making a statement that says, "this is who I am!" No matter what you're feeling or what you're going through there's a song that will put your feelings into words and when you listen to it, you'll realize you're not as alone as you might feel. If you honestly can't find that perfect song to fit how you're feeling, write one of your own! Sit down with your guitar, or sit on your piano bench, or sit with nothing but a pen and paper and hear it all in your head instead. Who knows, maybe your words turned into a song will help someone else feel less alone, or fill them with strength when they need it or even possibly melt their hearts.

One of the first songs I ever wrote was about girl-drama that was going on



in my junior high classroom. I never dared play it in front of the girls it was about because I was too afraid of them doing something terrible to me because of it, but every time they'd do or say something snotty or mean I'd just sit at my desk, fold my hands and smile because through that song, I'd already

expressed exactly how I felt about the situation and in my mind that was enough 'revenge' to keep me strong and un-imtimidated; just to know that the song existed and if I ever needed to show them how I really felt, I had the power to do that. I was only twelve going on thirteen at the time but I learned such a powerful lesson about music through that song. I learned that having the ability to express your emotions, no matter what you are, puts life into a whole new perspective. It saved my teenage years in so may ways. While other frustrated, confused teens were struggling just like I was to find their place to vent their frustrations about growing up and all the baggage that comes with it by sneaking out and drinking, smoking, getting into trouble just to make a statement, I was strumming my guitar and writing, writing writing. There wasn't anything that couldn't be coped with through music. I wish I could share this gift with the entire world because when I look around at all the things happening today, whether its small individual things like a teenager going through a breakup or huge world issues like the War and the election and environmentalism, I truly feel as if everyone had the outlet I do so many issues would be solved. I know that's a bold and dangerous statement to make but I'm going to make it anyway because I believe in the truth of it that much.

These days, there are so many opportunities out there for singers and songwriters alike. Myspace has started a huge phenomenon in independent music. Sometimes I stay up late at night and cruise Myspace just for fun and I come across the most amazing singers and songwriters that I would have never known about otherwise. I listen to their music and bookmark the songs I like best so I can revisit them over and over again. Sometimes I'll come across a page from an unsigned artist and the next month I'll run across the artist on a booking for a local Nashville show, or other times that artist will be picked up and suddenly there's news all around Nashville about the new buzz they're

creating. I get so excited because I remember their songs and I think to myself, "Finally more people can hear what I've heard from them! I can say to others, "Have you heard this song? Its amazing!" I get so super excited because I feel like in a way its watching a butterfly emerging from its cocoon and I feel so lucky because I was one of the first to see the beauty of their musical creations.




Miranda Lambert concert review


Introducing a new dynamic duo Carter Twins

As creative and fun as other shows are, the Fearless Tour stands in a league of its own bringing to you what feels like personal entertainment unlike a concert and more spontaneous than a rehearsed play at the theater. Getting to a Fearless show early is an absolute must. There's always fun things going on, Meet and Greets for Taylor, Kellie and Gloriana, radio station giveaways, etc. As a lot of people know,





Taylor has no official fan club and a lot of people seem clueless as to how to get a Meet and Greet. Radio stations give them away, so there's always a chance of that but if that doesn't work out for you, the best way to go about things is just to ask! Taylor's parents are awesome and if you see them around pre-show and ask them for a pass, there's a chance you might get one! Don't quote us on any guarantees there but both of her parents are very nice and approachable. If they have extra passes and you ask, they will give them to you.

The show opens with the amazing newcomers Gloriana. If you haven't heard of them, consider yourself banned from reading further until you look them up and listen! Their first single off of their debut album. "Wild At Heart" amazed us from the first moment we heard it and we knew this foursome was going to be amazing. The Gossin brothers, Tom and Mike, formerly of a band called Madison Rose, joined forces with Chevenne Kimball and Rachel Reinert to form Gloriana, signed by Emblem. At the beginning of the tour, the four of them would get on stage to open the show solo, but now they have a full band. The band is great and compliments them nicely but we thought they held their own quite well, too. Their voices harmonize perfectly and they're great at getting the crowd involved. They seemed a little bit nervous during the earlier shows but they've eased into what its like to play in front of a crowd this size now and despite the fact that the girls were recently sick, they still put 100% of themselves into their performances. Taylor picked the perfect band to open her show and rev up the crowd. We love them. One of us also had the opportunity to interview them for a country blog late last spring and in person they're all friendly and hilarious, just as welcoming as they are on stage. The

Kellie Pickler takes the show next, strutting out in her high heels and throwing her bubbly personality out in the crowd. She's perky, she's fun, she's got a great Country twang in her voice and her songs are both energetic and heartfelt. "I Wonder" will always be a personal favorite of ours, and "Best Days Of Your Life", where Taylor does backup; its obvious Taylor co-wrote this song with her, its confrontational woman-power vibe is catchy, fun and get-up-and-dance worthy! Pickler has a great ability to make the crowds laugh and keep their attention.

In between Kellie and Taylor's sets, Gloriana usually sets up a table and does autographs. At the earlier shows, when people weren't as acquainted with them the lines weren't as long but now people are clambering for their chance to get an autographed 8x10, or a signed CD. Before their album came out you could buy their EP for five dollars and have them sign it, a great keepsake to have and a really awesome preview of how amazing their album was going to be.

Of course, the best and most amazing part of any Fearless tour is without a doubt, the Headliner. (We still love you to pieces though, Gloriana and Kellie!) Taylor really goes to town with her constant costume changes, opening strong with an energetic band-geek ensemble for "You Belong With Me". All of her songs are theatrical performances, from the cafeteria table and boy for "Teardrops On My Guitar" to the red chair and the guy who looks a lot like Joe Jonas for her performance of "Forever N' Always." The dancers that they've added to the tour ensemble compliment the performance of "Love Story" beautifully, and our personal favorite is "The Way I Loved You" where Grant is cast as the rebel she can't get over, and she spends a good portion of the song pushing him around. We love Taylor's entire band but Grant, with his perfect hair and treasured guyliner definitely ranks on the 'Rum Chaser Favorites'

list! During one song, (We're not going to say which!) Taylor mysteriously appears right in the crowd! A different place at each venue, its spontaneous and fun and for all you know it could happen right where you are. All the theatrics were planned by Taylor herself and it shows with the energy and personal touches that go into every single song. Whether its the first night of the weekend or the fourth night in a row of these high-energy performances, Taylor always gives her all. She's truly and genuinely appreciative of her fans and it always shows in everything she does, which is a large part of why seeing her perform live is always such a treat.


